#### Top Ten Rules to Make Your Career Last

- 1. Follow your school board policy for acceptable use of technology.
- 2. See Rule number one.
- 3. As a professional, your speech should reflect it. Avoid name-calling or using slang, especially when communicating with parents.
- 4. Adopt this simple principle: anything you post on the internet should be appropriate to share face to face with your students, parents, principal, superintendent, and board members. This includes your Facebook page (and/or other social networking sites) no matter how private you think it is. Never friend a student on Facebook or other social networking sites.
- 5. Never transport a student without authorization.
- 6. Avoid being alone with a student. If it is unavoidable, leave your door open the entire time.
- 7. Do not invite students to your home.
- 8. Avoid physical contact with students, even as a gesture of comfort. This can be grossly misinterpreted by a student or a parent.
- 9. Do NOT single out a student or groups of students for favoritism.
- 10. Read your contract and follow it!
